WHAT ARE ADDITIONAL PRECAUTIONS?

It is respiratory season, and with that comes signs that pop up on resident room doors in our home. These signs show how visitors, staff, and other residents can remain safe by stopping the transmission of communicable diseases like Influenza, COVID-19, RSV, and many other viruses and bacteria that can make us sick. It is vital to follow the instructions on the signs, and if you are every unsure, ask one of our staff members.

They will be happy to help you to remain safe. Below is the most common sign you will see in our home during respiratory season. It is referred to as Droplet Contact Precautions and there are 2 versions. These signs are put in place on resident room doors when there is the possibility of 'catching' something that could make us ill while in the room. In this case, the illness would be transferred by germs on hard and soft surfaces, and by germs in the air in the form of moisture droplets. These droplets are because of coughing, sneezing, and nasal secretions.

These signs show us how to remain safe. The pictures show us the personal protective equipment that we need to enter the room. – Mask, gloves, gown. They also remind us that any shared equipment must be disinfected between rooms when staff or visitors are on the move.

2nd - Candlemas: Celebrated 40 days after Christmas and marked by the blessing of all candles to be used by a church during the coming year, this day observes the birth of light.
